Did You Know?

- That the northern boundary of Uniondale is Old Country Road?

- That the effort to have the boundaries of Uniondale recognized by the federal, state and local governments and the media has been a decades long project?

Document right was passed by the NY Assembly in 1984 affirming that Mitchel Field is located in Uniondale.



- That all of Mitchel Field and the major part of Roosevelt Field are in Uniondale and that in 2015 the Federal Census Bureau retired East Garden City as a census designated area for the 2020 census?
- That prior to the elimination of the controversial East Garden City census designation, the civic organizations of Uniondale had to convince both the Town of Hempstead and the County of Nassau to support the efforts to affirm, and to pass resolutions so stating, that the area north of Hempstead Turnpike legitimately lies within the boundaries of Uniondale and that East Garden City did not exist as an official designated hamlet of the Town or County.

MEMORIAL DAY

Parade and Ceremony at Uniondale Park

After a two-year hiatus due to the COVID pandemic, the Uniondale Community is preparing for a Memorial Day celebration. The parade will commence at 10:00am at Gerard St. and Uniondale Ave. and continue on Uniondale Ave. to the Uniondale Park for the memorial ceremony. School District Budget Vote

Residents passed the school budget proposition on May 17th by a vote of 770-400. The second proposition to fund Capital Projects through Capital Reserves also passed 623-258. Passage of the budget has been a contentious issue in the community for several years. The COVID Pandemic has been the situation worse. In 2020, voters were mailed an absentee ballot and in-person voting was cancelled due to the pandemic. The proposition failed. In 2021, the proposed budget was voted down again. The issue of the Uniondale boundaries (see info elsewhere in the newsletter) contributed to the number of NO votes cast in each of those two years. In both years, a revised budget was approved on the second vote but still with a significant number of NO votes cast.

Board members and administration are thankful to all who made the effort to vote and to those who worked toward a positive outcome.

Incumbents Addie Blanco Harvey and Carol Eason were elected to a second term on the school board.

Uniondale Peaceful Protest—Saturday, May 21st

Why: Uniondale’s borders are being infringed upon; Uniondale’s identity is being threatened; East Garden City does not Exist; Mitchel Field is in Uniondale!!

The above WHY was the explanation the community received on a flier announcing the protest. The community responded and came together on a beautiful Saturday morning to rally in support of Uniondale. The protest held in front of the Cradle of Aviation Museum was a testament to the determination of the residents of the hamlet of Uniondale that its boundaries be respected. The fight has been ongoing for decades and as one government entity agrees to adhere to the boundaries that extend north from the Southern State Parkway to Old Country Road and East from the official Hempstead and Garden City lines to the Meadowbrook Parkway and Merrick Ave as the Meadowbrook turns westward, a new administration reactivates the “East Garden City” myth.

Hopefully, the protest will be successful in educating a few more of our Elected Officials to the actual boundaries and to the commitment of the residents to force officials to utilize its proper name—Uniondale!

School District Construction Update

The additions currently under construction at the five elementary schools continue to progress. We have photos at three sites. The addition at Smith St. is behind the existing building, which does not allow for photos to be taken from the street. At Walnut St., the construction seems to have progressed to the laying of foundations.

Plans for Northern Pkwy elementary school called for additions to be added in three sections. At last check, progress has been made on the third section with the steel girders in place.

The photo above was created by “pasting” two photos together. The construction site on the north side of Charles Lindbergh Blvd. was so large that the camera lens was not wide enough to capture all of it in one photo. The site is directly opposite the Academy Charter School...the original building...and west of the Children’s Museum. The site poses a question about what might be planned for the site and whether the buildings, presumably there will be buildings, will have a Garden City address as do the buildings on Museum Row or Uniondale Address as the Charter School does. The site is south of the sign that welcomes traffic to UNIONDALE as they enter the complex from Stewart Ave.

Or perhaps the East Garden City name will resurface. On that note take time to visit Legislator Kevan Abrahams website and enlarge the map of District 1 on the home page. In fairness, the map is most likely provided by Nassau County as the legislators are assigned pages as part of the County website. But EAST GARDEN CITY should be eliminated from all County maps—it does not exist!

Women's History Month Honorees

Legislator Kevan Abrahams' office in conjunction with Fidelis Care hosted a virtual tribute for outstanding contributions to the community to women who live or work in the Legislative District 1. The virtual event was aired on Saturday March 26th. Nassau's Legislative District 1 includes Uniondale, Roosevelt and portions of East Meadow, Hempstead and Freeport. Of the women who were included in the program, five had roots in Uniondale.

The event included some entertainment and several rounds of trivia relating to women and the role that they played in the history of this country.



Denise Louther-Williams, was the host of the event and edited the biographical information so that each recipient was introduced in a most flattering and well-scripted way. Denise, an author and poet, is the secretary at Northern Parkway Elementary School and was a "surprise honoree" at the conclusion of the program.

She founded DLW Productions in order to provide an outlet for her artistic and performance interests. An online post said: "with DLW Productions, I assert my artistic side which includes acting, storytelling, directing and producing theater/performance pieces. Under DLW, I also create one of a kind jewelry pieces."

Charmise Desiré performed during the program. Her beautiful voice added a note of importance and thankfulness to the occasion.

Charmise is currently a member of the Uniondale School Board and served as president of that vital group for two years—2019-21. She is involved in many community civic organizations and has been an involved parent in various school programs and organizations including the PTA. Charmise is a graduate of the Parent Leadership Institute of Long Island.



Rahsmia Zatar is the Executive Director of S.T.R.O.N.G. Youth. As a young Latina child of immigrant parents on Long Island, Rahsmia soon became aware of the impact of racial and economic inequality on people of color around the world. While studying at Stony Brook for a Master's in Social Work, she met Sergio Argueta, and accepted an offer to join the staff of S.T.R.O.N.G. A Uniondale based organization, S.T.R.O.N.G.'s mission is to empower youth and communities in becoming active agents of change and building resources from within. Appointed Executive Director in 2012, she helped establish and run S.T.R.O.N.G. University, a gang intervention program working with previously incarcerated, gang involved young people.



She supports the UCC's Youth Project by volunteering to do arts and crafts projects with the students, primarily during summer camp.
