### Quentin Johnson: James Ross Memorial Award.

This Award was made in memory of Uniondale resident James Ross, a veteran and retiree member of the New York City Police Department. James could always be depended upon to help out with the many tasks associated with the Council's annual Dinner Dance or Cookout. His beloved wife, Julia has been a long-time member of the Uniondale Community Council Board of Trustees.

**Quentin Johnson** ranks 18th in the class of 2022 and has participated in much community service both here on Long Island and in North Carolina where he has spent the last four summers working on Harpo Farms, LLC. The company specializes in excavating, hauling, demolition and grading services. On one project, Quentin helped to install French drains to mitigate the flooding on the property. He says that he gained skills that would be beneficial in any community needing an environmental cleanup.

He has also worked with children at 3D's After-care, Inc. in Baldwin where he helped with homework, engaged in physical activities and craft projects. He acted as a mentor in social situations and initiated conflict resolution as needed.

Quentin plans on a career in computer science and says his experience at Hello Gorgeous, New York, where he worked with a graphic designer to visualize, design and create content spaces for women's programs, exposed him to the variety of ways technology can be and is being utilized.

### Gabriela Mateo Ernest and Marie Catanese Award



Ernest and Marie Catanese spent a good deal of their married lives advocating for others and the community of Uniondale. Ernie, well into his 90s is still doing just that. Marie and Ernie were the impetus for the saving of the Farm Stand and moving it to Uniondale Park where it is now a Children's Farm Museum. They also fought for the restoration of a small plot of land at the corner of Uniondale Ave. and Nassau Rd. that had become a dumping ground for the debris others needed to discard. A years long fight resulted in the area becoming the Martin Luther King Peace Park. Ernie was present in the spring of 2021 for the planting of a magnolia tree in the park and assisted in the ceremonial shoveling of dirt around the tree. In the fall of 2021, he returned with his family in tow to the park when the County of Nassau named the section of Uniondale Ave south of Jerusalem Ave. as Catanese Way.

**Gabriela Mateo** has just completed a two-year Medical Assistant program at Nassau BOCES' Barry Tech where the grading system balances knowledge with hands-on skills and work ethic. Upon completion candidates are Certified Clinical Medical Assistants. Part of the program involves volunteering at the Nassau Medical Center where Gabriela has learned to take "vitals" as well as handling

the mundane but very necessary task of distributing dinner trays. She tell us that she loves “helping patients” and provides assistance wherever needed.

Gabriela says she likes to try different things and in doing so, she embarked on becoming a mentor for a program, Building Young Moguls, that encourages youngsters 11-17 from low-income families to create a business model—concept, logo, etc. and make a presentation for the class on their proposed business.

### Victoria Goris

#### Jonathan Jackson Memorial Award

The Jonathan Jackson Memorial Award is given each year in memory of Jonathan

Jackson, a talented young man who passed from this earth much too soon. He was a graduate of Uniondale High School where he was active in the music program. His mother Hattie Jackson, a community activist and a School District employee supported the memorial for many years until her own demise a few years ago. The UCC has continued the award both

in memory of this young man and to recognize the commitment of his mother to the community and her support of young members through this memorial award.

**Victoria Goris** envisions a career in service and is scheduled to work toward a double major in Social Work and Psychology in college. That goal is evident in her list of activities and volunteer experiences. She is an active member of the HS Key Club, the Latinos Unidos and the High School Peer Mentoring program. Each of these organizations is organized around the premise of giving back by helping fellow students and community groups. The Key Club is a national organization that requires members to perform service to the community and fellow students. Victoria has been a member of the club for all four years of her High School career and participated in activities that span involvement in school, community and church. The Latinos Unidos is a local organization also advocating community service in which Victoria has also been a member in grades 9-12 and served as its president in her senior year.

The COVID pandemic put a hiatus on the activities of the Peer Mentoring program at Uniondale High School. But as in-person school resumed, Victoria re-activated her involvement in the group serving as Vice-President. In that capacity she coordinated conferences that were held with the participation of students, staff and community residents with the objective to make plans to support the emotional, social and education performance of students as they adjusted following the interruption of the normal school programs caused by the pandemic.

#### UCC Founders Award

During the more than forty years of the existence of the Uniondale Community Council there has been a long list of community members who have worked to make the organization a viable component of the community, one which strives to meet its goals in support of the children, the young people, seniors,



residents and businesses in the Greater Uniondale Area. Each year, the Board of Trustees votes on the Senior Awards, not just the recipients but those to be honored or memorialized by the awards. As the years progressed, the list of those who deserve thanks and recognition for their support and efforts on behalf of the Uniondale Community Council grew. The Founders Award is included annually to remember all those who we wish to remember and to not forget their dedication to the UCC..

**Sebastian Vega** ranks 8th in a class of 525 students. He is a member of the National Honor Society as well as the Math and Science Honor Societies. He participates in the Key Club, is a member of the Varsity Baseball Team and a member of the Superintendent’s Student Council, a select group of students who worked with the Superintendent to plan an orientation program for incoming Freshmen. In spite of a rigorous academic and extra-curricular activity schedule, Sebastian also amassed 100 hours of volunteer efforts, a significant number of those tutoring one student this school year in Math, Science and English—to ensure that student’s opportunity to graduate.

Sebastian plans on a career in finance and with that goal in mind, he participated in a volunteer program where students assist in the various district offices. He spent considerable time on projects in the Uniondale School District Central Business Office.

of her volunteer service, though science related, is not geared to dental work. She volunteers at the Center for Science, Teaching and Learning in Rockville Center. The organization creates corporate programs and educational workshops but also administers the Tanglewood Preserve. At the Center, Sydney performed two tasks. She acted as an exhibit interpreter for visitors but also was an animal caretaker, feeding the animals and cleaning their enclosures. Sydney tells us that the animals range from rabbits to goats to more exotic creatures such as alligators, lizards and an emu. Many of the animals that are sheltered came from people who had them as pets only to realize that they could not properly care for them; or perhaps had been imported illegally and cannot be returned to their native habitat. According to Sydney, each has a story!

Exhibits are arranged to educate and working at the center Sydney has learned the importance of adopting appropriate pets and that animals in existence today have links to pre-historic creatures.

### Early Voting


New York State Primary Election in both the Democratic and Republic parties will take place on June 28, 2022.






