March—Women's History Month

Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County Commission on the Status of Women planned and executed a "Women's History Week" celebration in 1978. The organizers selected the week of March 8 to correspond with International Women's Day. The movement spread across the country as other communities initiated their own Women's History Week celebrations the following year.

In 1980, a consortium of women's groups and historians—led by the National Women's History Project (now the National Women's History Alliance)—successfully lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the Week of March 8th 1980 as National Women's History Week. In 1987 Congress passed Public Law 100-9, designating March as "Women's History Month."

Each year, a theme for the month is selected National Women's History Alliance, the theme for 2022 is "Women Providing Healing, Promoting Hope."

On Saturday, March 26th, County Legislator Kevan Abrahams, in conjunction with Fidelis Care will host a virtual celebration honoring local Women who make a difference. Three women with roots in Uniondale are among the Honorees: Nancy Skeete, Community Activist and president of the Uniondale Community Council; Rahsmia Zatar, Executive Director of S.T.R.O.N.G. Youth, a Uniondale based community development organization specializing in youth, gang, and gun violence prevention; and Kathleen Lyons, Secretary of the UCC.

Augie was the founder of the "trophy shop" that has provided hundreds of our students, friends and neighbors with plaques or trophies for outstanding achievements in academics, sports, businesses; thank yous for efforts on behalf of the community; or simply the tokens provided by the community "little league" organizations to youngsters participating in the given sport.

Augie began the business in a small store on Jerusalem Ave. in 1969 eventually moving to larger quarters in the current location on Uniondale Ave. at the corner of Hempstead Blvd.

The company has been long-time and dedicated sponsor of the Uniondale Community Council and its Youth Project. Their ads have appeared in the annual Dinner Dance Journal and on the placemat for our Cookouts. Even though the business was negatively impacted by the COVID Pandemic, their ad was included on the placemat for the Virtual Cookout in 2020!

Michael J. Ricigliano, Esq.


Michael Joseph Ricigliano was born in Brooklyn, the son of Rose and Antonio Ricigliano, but grew up in Uniondale where his family were active members of St. Martha's RC Church and the community.

Michael attended Hempstead High School where he was a star athlete, and St. John's University where he was the captain of the baseball team. He was signed to play minor league baseball for the Brooklyn Dodgers and a year later attended St. John's Law School.

He and his wife Michele (nee Murtha also a local Hempstead resident) were married in September 1962 and enjoyed 59 years of a happy marriage and raised three children, originally settling in Uniondale. In 1963, he joined the law firm of Margiotta and Planders, then located on Jerusalem Ave. Eventually, he became a partner in the firm, which now maintains two offices Margiotta and

Ricigliano, LLP on Earle Ovington Blvd in Uniondale and a second office in Islandia.

Ricigliano was inducted into the St. John's University Athletic Hall of Fame, and awarded the St. John's Outstanding Alumni Achievement Award. He served on the Boards of the Uniondale Public Library and the Hempstead Golf Club and was long-time counsel to the Town of Hempstead Housing Authority. In addition, he was a strong supporter of the Uniondale Community Council and its Youth Project.

A true Renaissance man, Michael Ricigliano successfully balanced two careers at once. In recent years, he developed a career as an artist, writer, and film producer, while also still practicing law on Long Island.

He has exhibited his abstract work at the Union League Club Gallery and the Lilac Gallery in Manhattan, as well as The Huntington Art Gallery on Long Island. He wrote and produced the feature

-length film, *The Brooklyn Banker* ("engrossing and grounded drama" NY Post), directed by Federico Castelluccio. Ricigliano's play, *A Queen for a Day*, directed by John Gould Rubin, had a very successful run Off Broadway, and is currently in preproduction for its feature film adaptation starring David Proval and is also directed by Castelluccio.

Michael is survived by his wife, Michele, son Francis (Anne), daughter Andrea (William) Creaser, Michael (Jeanne), eight grandchildren and a sister, Angela Betscha.

There are countless women who in the course of the history of this country and the world have made a difference— who exemplify this year’s theme: **Women Providing Healing, Promoting Hope.**

We provide a sampling of American Women:



Vice-President of the United States, **Kamala Harris.** She is the first woman to hold the office of Vice-President, the Second Highest office in the US. In addition, she is the first person of Asian Ancestry and the first Black person to be elected to the office of Vice-President,



Justice **Sandra Day O'Connor** was the first women to be appointed to the United States Supreme Court.



First Lady **Betty Ford** made headlines when she announced to the public that she had been diagnosed with Breast cancer, rather than allow the media speculation that was common to dictate the story. She was further forth coming about her struggle with substance abuse.

Katherine Johnson. She was one of several black women “computers” hired by NASA in the early 1960s. When she graduated with a degree in Math in 1937, her career options were limited...she was a woman and an African American. Although segregated because of their race, these women provided the Mathematical data that allowed the US to send a man to the moon.



Ruth Bader Ginsberg was the second woman to serve on the Supreme Court. She experienced discrimination in obtaining a job in the legal profession because she was a woman. She became a strong advocate for individual rights regardless of gender. She was appointment by President Bill Clinton in 1993 and served until her death in September 2020.

First Lady **Eleanor Roosevelt** was the wife of one president, and the niece of another. Raised in NYC and on Long Island in the home of Theodore Roosevelt, she married a distant cousin, Franklin Roosevelt. She was first lady from 1933-1945,



longer than any other woman and she changed the mold of the position— from day one. She invited only women journalist to her first press conference.

Women Secretaries of State

The United States has had seventy-one Secretaries of State. Only three of them have been women: Madeleine Albright (1997-2001), Condoleezza Rice (2005-2009), and Hillary Clinton (2009-2013).

All three of these impressive women came from humble backgrounds and made indelible contributions to American diplomacy.



New Yorker's For Clean Power

This organization will make a presentation, advocating for Clean Energy at the March meeting of the Uniondale Community Council. Join the meeting — the environment and climate change are major areas of concern affecting everyone.

New Yorkers for Clean Power (NYCP) is a statewide campaign to transition to a clean energy economy as quickly as possible. In 2019, New York State enacted the most ambitious climate legislation in the nation. The Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA or Climate Act) sets a bold target: net zero emissions of climate-warming pollutants by 2050, including a rapid transition from fossil fuel power to clean, renewable energy.¹ New Yorkers have the opportunity to lead this clean power movement by:

- raising awareness about the transition to a clean energy economy;
- increasing support for wind and solar projects;

- implementing clean transportation and green job initiatives;
- connecting New York homes and businesses with clean energy technologies and energy efficiency measures; and
- developing a clean energy internship and career pipeline for students and youth in underserved communities.

NYCP contributes to New York's green job pipeline with our Clean Power Fellowship, a hands-on training program for clean energy advocates. Our Green the Grid & Electrify Everything presentations helps fellows reach out, educate and support communities throughout the state. The presentation explains the who, what, when, where, and why of a just transition to clean energy technologies, community organizing, the state climate goals, and the benefits of energy efficiency, wind and solar power, heat pumps, and electric vehicles. We present this work because we know that it's only together that we can transition to a safer, healthier, and more sustainable clean energy economy.

Local Ukrainian groups collected clothing, non-perishable supplies, household goods, medical and health supplies, so much of which we all take for granted. Run out of toothpaste?—It's no big deal, such items are available in supermarkets, pharmacies and even local convenience stores or bodegas. But not so easy to find in a war torn country.

The Long Island Chapter of the UCCA (Ukrainian Churches of America) established a donation center **RIGHT HERE IN UNIONDALE** at St. Vladimir's Center on Uniondale Ave. In one week's time they have collected more than enough to fill the allotted space. The issue is now finding funds to ship the goods to Ukraine and to Ukrainians who have left the country and are now refugees in Poland and other Eastern European Countries.

We spoke with Stepan Kunitski who said that any monetary donation —cash or check—would be greatly appreciated and that “no amount is too small” but the need is great.
